Our Mission

We believe that K-12 education should be free from indoctrination and politicization.

Our Goals

1. For Arizona to become a leader in education.
 - a. Leader in school choice.
 - b. Leader in character development.
 - c. Leader in Special Education Schools and Private Institutions.
 - d. Leader in technical and career development.
 - e. Leader in College-prepared graduates.
 - f. Leader in student achievement.
2. Restore relevance of education in the lives of Arizona families.

- a. Ditch teaching of hate and division through CRT, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion.
 - b. Promote classical education in the liberal arts and sciences, with instruction in the principles of moral character and civic virtue.
 - c. Ensure that curriculum resources are assessed for excellence and rating is publicly available. Since it is a monumental task for parents to go through all curriculum, the information will be available for them to decide if it is what they want their children taught in their perspective schools.
 - d. Protect parents' rights to direct the course of their children's education.
 - e. Protect parents' rights to be involved.
 - f. Investigate those in public education who violate the rights of the families they are required to serve.
 - g. Challenge the certificates of anyone who is not protecting the rights of our parents.
3. Focus on Early Literacy.
 - a. Ensure early literacy programs are fully funded and teachers are properly trained, to include rigorous phonic programs.
 - b. Work with failing schools to help them turn around their programs.
 - c. Allow families in failing schools to use ESAs to get into successful schools.
4. Support Arizona Teachers.
 - a. Let them focus on student achievement.
 - b. Eliminate certification fees by cutting waste and improving automation.
 - c. Expand the Arizona Teacher Academy usage.
 - d. Advocate more money to teachers to keep up with the rate of inflation and the CPI.
 - e. Provide a confidential outlet for teachers to share information and receive guidance.
 - f. Support teachers who oppose the coercion to indoctrinate students.
5. Work with the Legislature to drive family centered and student-centered policies, to promote student achievement and parent involvement.
 - a. Repeal laws that conflict with said goals and install punishment and ramifications to existing laws that are commonly ignored due to lack of enforcement or consequence.
 - b. Promote legislative initiatives at the local, state, and national levels to support the coalition's goals.
6. Provide real leadership in DC to secure the needed flexibility to drive student achievement in the way we need in AZ, not the way the DC bureaucrats want.
 - a. Partner with the State Board of Education and State Board for Charter Schools on needed improvements from the Federal Government.
 - b. Negotiate federal grants and funding to secure Arizona from federal overreach, and demand federal funds be withheld from educational institutions that engage in politicizing public schools and radical indoctrination.
7. Support legal actions against school districts that conduct discriminatory teaching and training.
 - a. Partner with Attorney General's Office to create a Parent Task Force to promptly address parental concern when violation of the law occurs or when an AG opinion is needed.
 - b. Support legal actions against school districts that conduct discriminatory teaching and training.

- c. Assuring proper resources are available for the Investigative unit in the State Board of Education to quickly investigate and prosecute law violations, as well as bring immediate disciplinary actions against school employees who violate state law and engage in sexual predatory conduct with students.
- d. Establishing a School Safety Unit to direct funding and resources that will ensure the physical, emotional, and intellectual safety of our children. The goal of the unit will be to eliminate outside threats from accessing schools, increase School Resource Officers presence, to address the increased use of drugs on school grounds and gang activities.

Our Strategy

1. Use all forms of media to expose the radical indoctrination in K-12 education, its perpetrators, the resources, and methods employed and the resulting harm it inflicts.
2. Inform the public of the coalition and encourage them to participate.
3. Mobilize community participation in school board meetings.
4. Guide parents in forming in-school committees to review, screen and monitor the curriculum, materials and any other resources used in all classes.
5. Furnish parents, families, community, educators and policy makers with the best available research, strategies, and tools to fight harmful indoctrination practices and curricula.
6. Facilitate legal counsel for parents and teachers who require support to battle school indoctrination through national organization(s), local government(s) and law enforcement agencies.
